THE LEGACY OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AIR SHOW: A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE AT MARCH AIR RESERVE BASE

MARCH AIR RESERVE BASE, Calif. – The Southern California Air Show has grown into one of the most anticipated and celebrated aviation events in the nation, rooted in decades of tradition at March Air Reserve Base (March ARB). Formerly known as March Field AirFest and Thunder Over the Empire, this event has become a signature display of air power, innovation, and community pride.

Established in 1918 as March Field, March ARB has been at the heart of U.S. military aviation for over a century. From its origins as a World War I pilot training base to its current mission supporting global mobility, combat airlift, and air refueling under Air Force Reserve Command, March ARB remains a symbol of enduring strength. AIR SHOW SECURITY: JOINT FORCES ENSURE SAFETY FOR 2025 SOCAL AIR SHOW

MARCH AIR RESERVE BASE, Calif. – Ensuring the safety of more than 400,000 spectators at the 2025 Southern California Air Show is a top priority for military and civilian agencies. The event, scheduled for April 12-13, 2025, at March Air Reserve Base, represents a full-spectrum joint effort between federal, state, county, and city agencies, working in unison to protect attendees and personnel.

"Every level of law enforcement is in lockstep, ensuring this air show is safe and secure," said Lt. Col. David Mcmanus, 452nd Security Forces Squadron commander. "The coordination you see happening involves multiple entities—from county and city agencies to federal and military partners—all collaborating to ensure a secure environment."

The 452nd Air Mobility Wing (AMW), in alignment with Air Force Reserve Command's priorities, leads security planning under the core principle of being 'Always Ready.' Security measures involve a multi-layered defense approach, integrating intelligence, emergency response, and real-time coordination between agencies.



"This air show is a 100% joint effort," Mcmanus added. "It's all about getting these agencies into one room, ensuring they collaborate effectively and work together without stepping on each other, while getting everything done that needs to be accomplished."

Key federal agencies such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Department of Homeland Security are actively engaged in intelligence sharing and threat assessments. The Riverside County Sheriff's Emergency Response Team and Moreno Valley Station deputies will provide additional support, reinforcing security protocols in partnership with base law enforcement personnel.

"I venture to say, March Air Reserve Base has the best collaborative relationships with all public safety agencies in and around the installation. This benchmark collaboration has ensured a robust security plan, in line with the principle "Always Ready". From the ground to the sky, we are watching and ready, to ensure maximum public safety and threat mitigation," said Master Sgt. Daniel Armstrong, 452nd Security Forces Squadron.

Local law enforcement, including city and county police, fire departments, and emergency medical services, will integrate with military security forces for real-time threat assessment and rapid response capabilities. Surveillance assets, crowd monitoring, and incident response teams will be positioned across the venue to address any potential security concerns swiftly and efficiently. "The goal was to bring military and civilian counterparts together to ensure an integrative security operation." said MSgt Armstrong.

With a comprehensive and coordinated approach, the 2025 Southern California Air Show demonstrates the power of joint operations. The collective efforts of military and civilian agencies exemplify the highest standards of security readiness, ensuring spectators can focus on the awe-inspiring aerial performances with confidence in their safety.

AIR FORCE RESERVE DELAYED ENTRY TRAINING FLIGHT PREPARES RECRUITS FOR MILITARY LIFE

March Air Reserve Base, Calif. - Each month, the Air Force Reserve's Delayed Entry Training Flight (DETF) program at March Air Reserve Base welcomes between 60 and 90 recruits, helping them transition from civilian life to military service.

The DETF program, held during the monthly Unit Training Assembly weekends, provides new fully enlisted recruits with lodging, meals, and pay while preparing them for the rigors of Basic Military Training. Over two days, trainees participate in briefings, physical fitness training, and career field discussions to familiarize themselves with the expectations and responsibilities of military service.

Leading the program is Master Sergeant Christopher Moreno, DETF coordinator and group training manager for the 452nd Mission Support Group. His guidance helps ensure recruits receive the preparation necessary for success in their military careers.

MSgt Moreno placed emphasis that the program isn't supposed to supplement the training provided or for the program coordinators to impersonate the military training instructors at Lackland. "This is simply an introduction of what they should be expecting," said Moreno. "We don't have them performing facing movements or marching, but we do have them learning customs and courtesies such as their reporting statement."

Long Beach native, Jalia Nelson, age 18, said "The program takes away the unexpected," Nelson, who joined the program in December 2024, is set to depart for BMT at Lackland Air Force Base in April. "We aren't blindsided compared to people who are in active duty."

By simulating aspects of BMT, DETF helps recruits build discipline, resilience, and confidence before they arrive at Lackland. The structured environment ensures they have a foundational understanding of military customs, courtesies, and expectations, easing their transition into service.



Devin Edwards, age 19, also from Long Beach, California, joined the program in March 2025 and is scheduled to leave for BMT in May. He plans to become an Aircraft Maintenance Technician. "I wish I had more time in the program because it does prepare you for the real experience," Edwards said.

The program is a vital resource for the Air Force Reserve, allowing recruits to acclimate to the military lifestyle while maintaining their civilian commitments until their departure for BMT. As March ARB continues to train and develop its future Airmen, the DET flight remains an essential tool in shaping well-prepared recruits ready to serve.
